Knox's Annual "State of the Union" Letter

Dear Knox Members and Friends:

We greet you at the start of a new year with deep gratitude to God for the blessing each of you brings to the life and witness of our church. Because of you, Knox is alive and well in the Spirit!

Our membership is growing and our mission outreach is touching more lives in more ways than ever before. As Knox celebrates the completion of fifty years of ministry, the labor of many has borne fruit in changed lives and enduring works of love.

2010 marked our Jubilee Year, which we celebrated all year long in many different ways. We celebrated with golf outings and bike ride fundraisers; with children's posters and a Float in the Labor Day Parade; with a Gift to the City of 25,000 hours of community service; and with memorable worship Sept. 12th drawing more than 1000 in attendance. We raised 1.2 million dollars toward the Jubilee Fund and gave generously to Missions at home and abroad. We sponsored 4 Great Banquet Weekends and served 12 times at Hesus House—including Christmas Day. We called Robert Thomas Quiring to serve Knox as our new Associate Pastor to Youth and Young Adults. We celebrated Eric Heinekamp's ordination as Associate Executive of the Presbytery of Chicago. We went forth in force to serve God in Mexico, New Orleans, Benton Harbor and Sisseton. We reached new levels of attendance at VBS and Family Camp while launching two new programs—Dance Camp and Drama Camp—later on last summer. Yes, 2010 was a year of jubilee: a year of bounty and blessings as we thanked God for the work of the Holy Spirit in our midst.

Numbers can reveal the story of growth or decline in a congregation. In 2010, Knox grew by 65 persons to reach an active membership of 1439. Knox's average weekly attendance grew from 645 to 659. Knox gave \$336,000 to Missions, representing 22% of our Annual Budget. Knox's Permanent Funds grew by \$69,000 to \$258,000. Over \$450,000 was received into the Jubilee Fund.

Numbers, however, cannot tell the whole story of loving hearts, generous hands, devoted serving and unswerving prayer. So much has been given and done by so many—it would be impossible to enumerate you all! Deb and I give thanks for each of you: particularly for the leadership of the Session, the devotion of the Deacons and the daily service of our Pastors and Staff. We are grateful to Nancy Fry and the Jubilee Steering Committee; to Amanda Hartley, Jim Burner, Sr. and the "Live the Vision" Team; to Derek Dusenberry and the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee; to Presbyterian Women; to the Go & Serve, Sisseton, Amor and New Orleans Mission Teams; to our Confirmation Team, Sunday School teachers, Stephen Ministers, Prayer Team and Small Group leaders; to our Praise Team, Chancel and Children's Choirs, Bell Choir, Tech Support Team and musicians; to our Ushers, Communion Servers, Acolytes, Welcomers, Coffee Hosts and everyone else who makes this church the welcoming, worshiping, nurturing house of prayer it is. We are grateful to each—and for all—of you.

- Knox raised \$1.2 million for The Jubilee Fund and has currently received \$450,000, bringing our mortgage below \$5 million.
