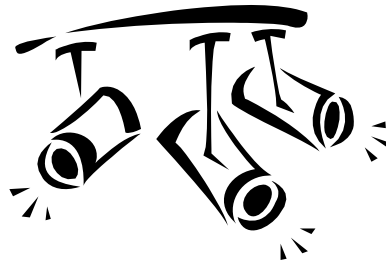

A Letter from Rev. Deb...

Dear Friends,

Consider Paul's words of greeting in Romans, Chapter 1...*Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God...to all God's beloved in Rome (in Knox), who are called to be saints. Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.*

What an exciting time it is to be the Church of Jesus Christ! What better time than in a world fraught with challenges to raise up new generations of Christians! Imagine confronting the challenges of our lives and our world without Christ and his Family. Imagine planning and dreaming without the Holy spirit equipping and guiding. Imagine chipping away at each day without the gift of God's grace to endure or soar or serve.

It is a humbling and a happy thought to discover that God calls every person. God calls you and I to live a life of hope and service. - Large medical bills
- Job loss or major income reduction
- Giving \$\$ to other family members
- Simply spending more than you make

How do you begin to climb out of this hole?

- 1) List all your debts, including balances and interest rates.
- 2) If possible, commit to bringing on no new debt.
- 3) While continuing to make the minimum payment on all the cards, accelerate and pay off the smallest balances with the highest rates. Pay one off, go to the next one.

The Sunday School Scoop



In September,

Sunday School will begin a new curriculum for preschool and elementary classes. It is called *Walk With Me*, published by Faith Alive. The Middle School class will continue to use various curriculums specific to their experiences.

Walk With Me Goals:

- To nurture and encourage each child to know, love, and serve God.
- To nurture the faith of children and their teachers within a caring community.
- To teach children the story of scripture.
- To challenge children and teachers to live their faith.
- To equip children to share their faith and serve others in the community.
- To partner with families in the faith nurture of their families.

Walk With Me is designed for the uniqueness of each age and the differences in learning styles. Activities are fun and encourage a child's interest and curiosity.

What families need to know that will not change with the new curriculum:

- Knox wants to join parents in the nurture of their child's faith. We will continue to communicate with parents about each week's lesson.
- Knox values children as a significant part of the church family. We earnestly want your child to know they are loved by a faithful, powerful and loving God.

What families need to know that will change with the new curriculum:

- Each Sunday, every class will not be experiencing the same lesson. Each class has their own sequence of lessons. The scope of a class's lessons is appropriate for that age group.
- The class age groups will be different than last year. For preschool and elementary age children there are still 5 classes, but the classes are now:
 - Preschool (age 3 as of September 1)
 - PreK (age 4 as of Sept. 1 and older but not in Kindergarten)
 - Kindergarten & 1st Grade
 - 2nd & 3rd Grade
 - 4th & 5th Grade

PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

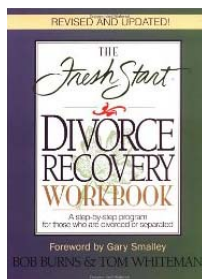
